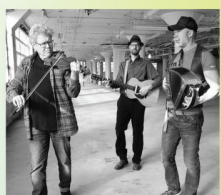

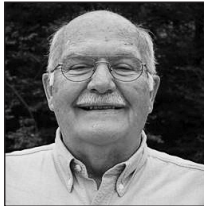

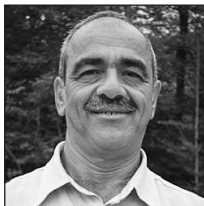

MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Dear friends,
Each year, the members of Council meet in December to establish a list of priorities to include in the municipal budget and to be put forward for the following year. This year, Council established the following priorities:

Community life and events

Community life in Gore is extremely dynamic for a small community like ours. This year, we will focus on the municipal park. Thanks to the Territory Development Fund (FDT - from the MRC), we will be able to change the play structure at the park to make it comply with safety standards for children under 5 years of age. We are proud to announce that a product from the Quebec company, Cour à Bois, was chosen. The company will design and install our new play structure. It will be made of untreated wood and will be the first of its kind in Quebec. In addition, the sum awarded from the FDT will also allow us to improve the facilities offered at the dog park.

Road projects: improvement and maintenance of infrastructure

Our municipality has invested a lot in recent years on its main roads. In 2018, Scott, Chevreuil and Braemar roads were completely redone. Several major culverts have been changed and the gravel roads have been maintained as efficiently as possible. However, much work remains to be done. This year, with the help of the TECQ (Gas Tax Program and the provincial government's contribution from Quebec), we will be able to repair Lac Grace Road, repair the asphalt on Lac Hughes Road by removing the deteriorated material, and we will be correcting the profile of Braemar Road to improve visibility at a specific location.

Lake Beattie Nature Park Project

As you all know, this project has been close to my heart for several years. Giving public access to a lake for families and residents of Gore is important to

everyone's quality of life. Last year, thanks to the support of the MRC and the Laurentians' Wardens' table, we obtained a grant of \$ 150,000 (\$ 50,000 per year over 3 years) from the Regional Support Fund (FARR). This significant amount will allow us to carry out construction of the access road this year. We are always looking for grants and are relentlessly applying for government programs! Obviously, we want to get as much money as possible so as not to add too much of a tax burden on the population. The nature park project will include trails for cross-country skiing, hiking and mountain biking. In addition, lake access as well as canoe and paddle board rentals will be available on site.

Environment

Environmental issues have always been a priority for the Municipal Council. This year, we are continuing our sustained efforts to bring all septic systems within our territory up to standards. The health of our lakes is essential to the quality of life of our residents. We will also invest to ensure that the Solar, Caroline and Dawson lake dams remain in good condition by participating in the provincial government's PAFMAN program.

Tackling the problem of short-term rentals Airbnbs

Recently, we have received complaints regarding short-term rentals of cottages in several areas within Gore where this is not allowed. Temporary tenants cause nuisances to the neighborhood by making a lot of noise late at night, by parking on the street or by leaving garbage lying around the rental property. We have sent several notices to owners who are breaking the law. Unfortunately our warnings have not dissuaded them. We will have no choice but to crack down and enforce the fines provided for in the municipal by-laws and above all, to report the owners to the provincial government. The peace of mind of our residents is a priority and we intend to make the necessary efforts to stop the proliferation of Airbnb rentals. We

SNOWMOBILERS: BE CAREFUL AND RESPECTFUL

We ask all snowmobilers to respect their neighbors and use the trails provided for this purpose. The "Hibou Blanc" club (<http://clubmotoneigehiboublanc.com/>) can provide you with this information. To make snowmobiling safe, it is

important to remember:

- wear a helmet even off trail. Helmets are also compulsory for passengers.
- keep the vehicle's white headlight (s) and the rear red position light on at all times;
- respect speed limits and keep a safe distance between your vehicle and the vehicle in front;
- it is forbidden to drive while under the influence of alcohol or drugs;
- before going out, know the ice conditions on lakes and rivers and avoid unsafe bodies of water;

- cross public roads at the designated places. To take a public road, the driver must hold a valid driver's license.

CARAMEL AND PRETZEL SQUARES

INGREDIENTS

Shortbread

- 1 cup (150 g) unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup (35 g) icing sugar
- 6 tbsp (85 g) unsalted butter, softened

Caramel

- 1 can (300 ml) sweetened condensed milk
- 3 tbsp (40 g) unsalted butter

Topping

- 4 oz (115 g) milk chocolate, chopped
- 2 tbsp (30 ml) 35% heavy cream
- 3/4 cup (50 g) crushed pretzels

PREPARATION

Shortbread

With the rack in the middle position, preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Butter an 8-inch (20 cm) square baking dish and

line the bottom with a sheet of parchment paper, letting the paper hang over two sides.

In a bowl, combine the flour and icing sugar. Add the butter and combine until the dough forms. Press onto the bottom of the prepared dish.

Bake for 10 minutes or until light golden brown.

Caramel

Meanwhile, in a saucepan, bring the condensed milk and butter to a boil, then simmer for 5 minutes, whisking constantly. Pour the caramel over the warm shortbread.

Bake for 15 minutes. Let cool completely on a wire rack.

Topping

Place the chocolate and cream in a bowl. Microwave for 1 minute or until heated through. Using a spatula, stir until the chocolate is melted and the ganache is smooth. Spread over the cooled caramel.



Immediately sprinkle with the pretzels. Let set for 1 hour at room temperature.

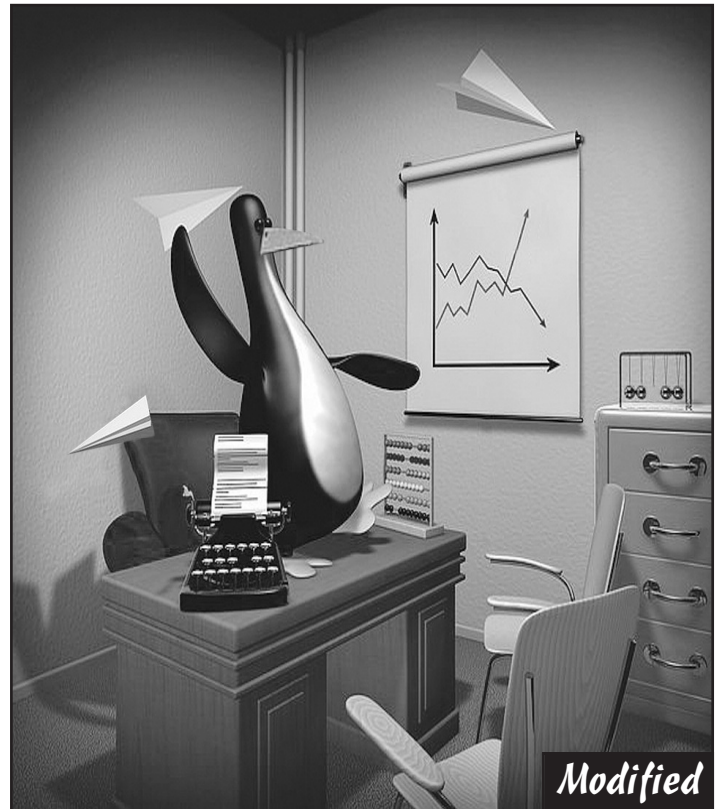
Cut into squares. The caramel and pretzel squares will keep for 1 week in an airtight container at room temperature.
